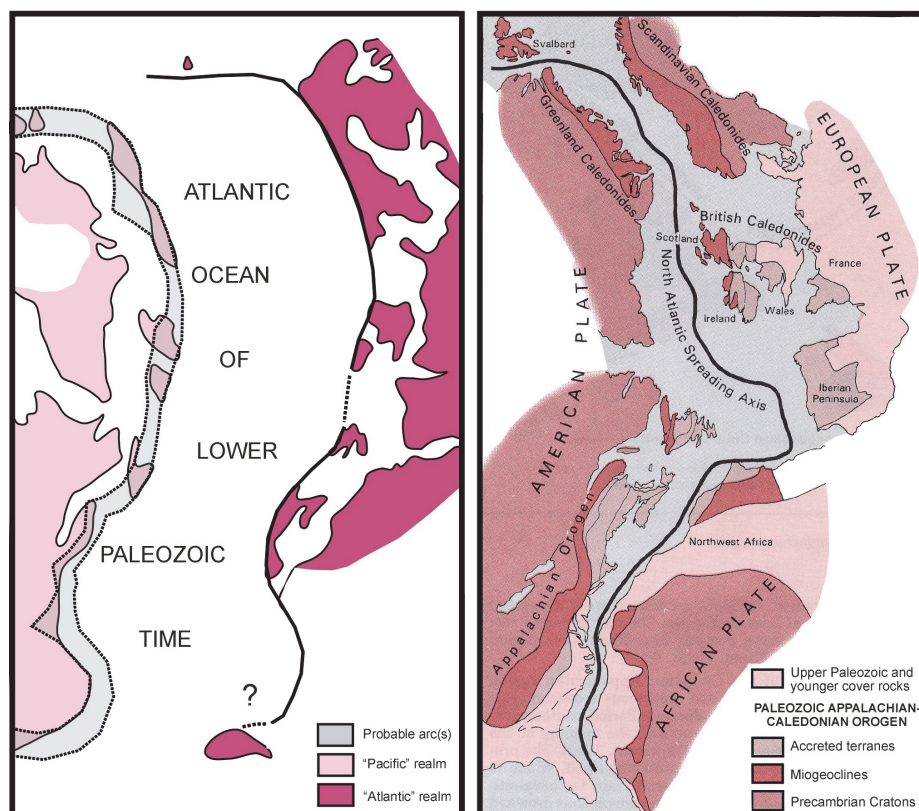




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Cover Image: The changing views of the North Atlantic borderlands.
